



INSTRUCTIONS

Aim of the game

To help with understanding escape plans in a friendly and interactive way. Young people work their way through the challenges and the goal is to crack the code and reinforce the message to BE SAFE.

Set Up

Below is a guide on how to prepare the game ready for young people to enjoy!

1. Cut out the envelopes and clues (letters) with the template provided
2. Fold the envelope template together (can be secured with glue) and place each clue into one of the envelopes.
3. Attach the 'TOP SECRET' folder to the answer page so that the answers are covered - this can be revealed once the young people have discovered the code!
4. Lay out the remainder of the pages, ready for the fire safety quest to begin!

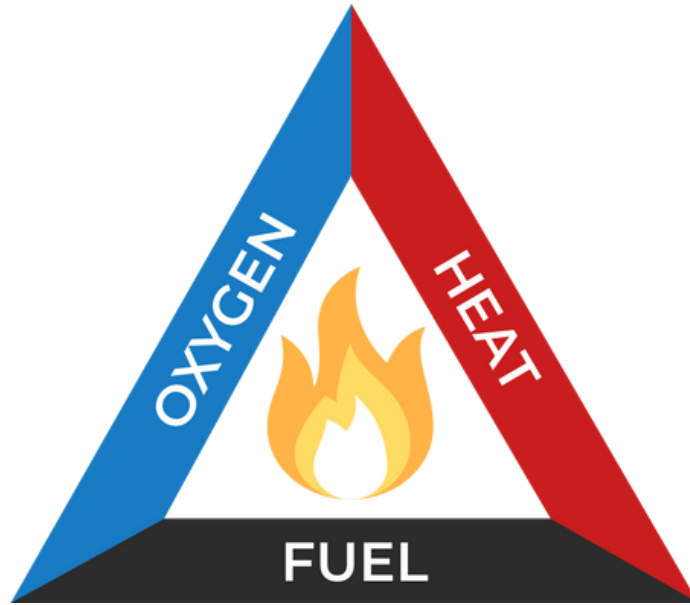
CHALLENGE #1
